# A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE REQUIREMENT THAT STATE-SUPPORTED INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION VERIFY THE VISA STATUS OF ENROLLED FOREIGN STUDENTS FROM SPECIFIED COUNTRIES WITH LINKS TO ISLAMIC TERRORISM.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Requires registrars at state-supported institutions of higher education annually to verify with the United States bureau of citizenship and immigration services the visa status of all enrolled foreign students from specified countries with links to Islamic terrorism and to report the visa status to the Colorado commission on higher education.

19	(3) (a) The registrar at each state-supported institution of
20	HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL VERIFY WITH THE UNITED STATES BUREAU OF
21	CITIZENSHIP AND IMMIGRATION SERVICES THE VISA STATUS OF ALL
22	FOREIGN STUDENTS FROM IRAN, IRAQ, LEBANON, AFGHANISTAN,
23	PAKISTAN, SAUDI ARABIA, SYRIA, SUDAN, SOMALIA, TUNISIA, MOROCCO,
24	YEMEN, EGYPT, LIBYA, THE UNITED ARAB EMIRATES, MALAYSIA,
25	Indonesia, and the Phillippines, who are enrolled at the
26	INSTITUTION. EACH REGISTRAR SHALL REPORT THE VISA STATUS OF EACH
