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Flying Saucers SUBJECT:

> A rapid perusal of your documents leaves one confused and inclined to supineaess.

The following considerations seem not to have been included. in the survey:

No suggestion is noted that there is a possibility that many of the objects may be "free" neteorological sounding balloons.

If a tame "flying saucer" is to be involved, it is extremely unlikely that they be found over the U. S. because:

- (1) U.S. developments would be closely coordinated with USAF or commercial designers.
- (2) Foreign eircraft development would hardly be tested at such a range from home areas, even if fuel could be suppliéd≡
- (3) Ouided aircraft at a range of several thousand miles are beyond any known capabilities, including ours.
- What is the psychological probability that eny object seen briefly against "zero" background will be circular, or oval, in appearance?
- Has any one commented on the curious time distribution of the observations? Note thart below:
